Dear Hospital Administrator,

As our state and nation continue deal with the impact of COVID-19, my team and I at the Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA) are working hard to ensure the citizens we serve have the resources they need to combat, treat, and ultimately defeat this dangerous virus. As I am sure you are aware, many hospitals are running low on tests, masks, gloves, hand sanitizer, and other necessary materials. With this in mind, I am writing you today to inform you of a few resources you may not be aware of but could utilize during this time of urgency.

As we are contacted with information about product availability, I will forward this information to you.

Two medical companies have contacted TDA that are offering supplies for purchase in this trying time. The first company, 220 LAB Group, is an accredited medical laboratory that provides laboratory testing services including toxicology, chemistry testing, and molecular pathology. They are currently offering KN-95 Mask 100MM, N-95 3M Mask 2MM, surgical gowns, hand sanitizer, surgical gloves, boot covers, and clear 3M face shields. The second company, Health First Medical Solutions, is a medical software technology company that specializes in medical informatics engineering.
